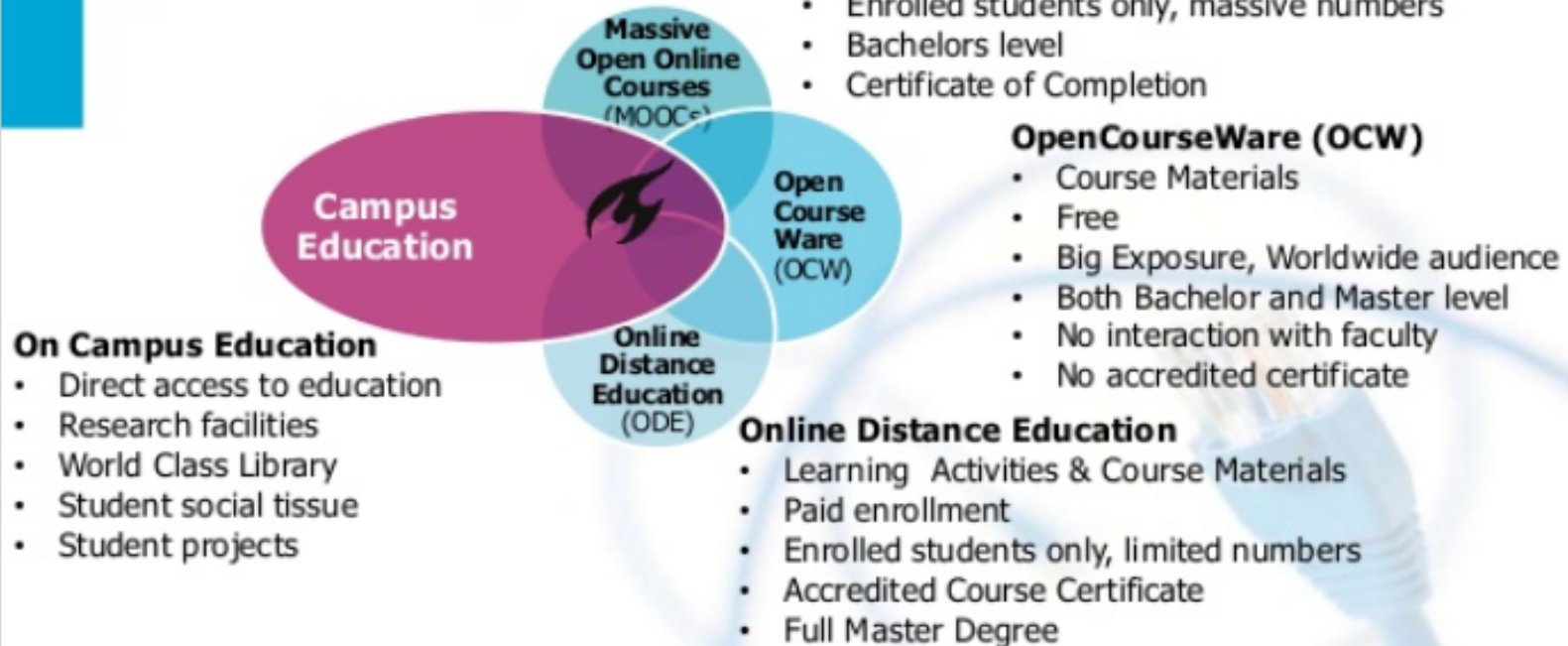

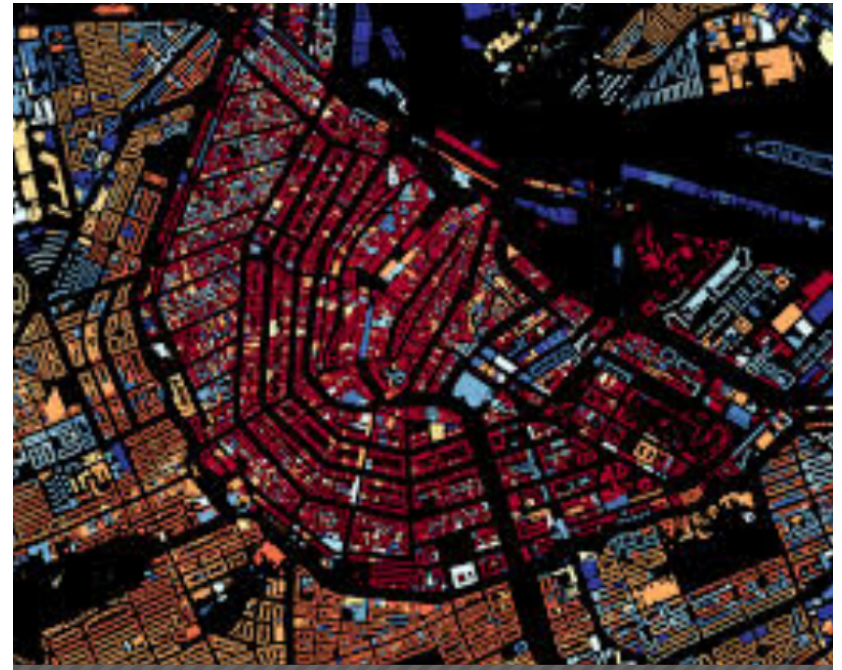
## 2 Routes

Green	Gold
Authors make their own work publicly available.	Publications are made freely accessible immediately.
Online publication via (institutional) repository.	Online publication through the publishers' own platforms.
But in many cases there is an embargo on the final version of articles, so author-versions are published.	Researchers or funder of institution pays APC (article processing costs) or other payment but no subscription.
No change of business model for publisher required.	Big change of business model for publishers.

The Netherlands strongly prefer the Gold Route.

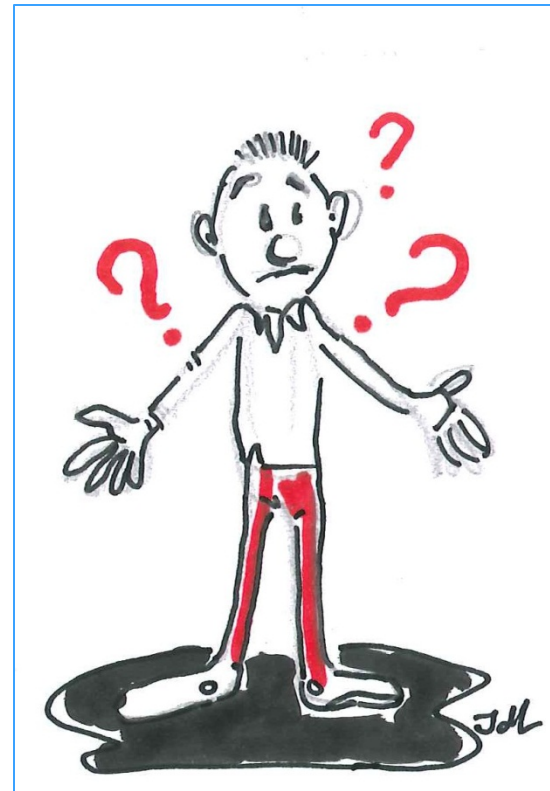


# Bottlenecks Open Access

- Traditional business model subscriptions big revenues
- Transfer of rights hinders Open Access and reuse of publications
- Reputation (and citations) is crucial, not the way of dissemination

## Open access

The arrival of the Internet radically changed opportunities for disseminating scientific knowledge. Digitisation has meant that potentially anyone with Internet access can benefit from new scientific insights. Open access aims to make findings from scientific research (particularly that financed through public funding) freely available online to as many people as possible. Dutch universities strongly support open access and have been working to achieve it in various ways over the past few years.

Recently, the topic has come under the scrutiny of the government too. In a letter to the Lower House, the state secretary took the view that publicly funded research should, in principle, be freely accessible. Like the United Kingdom, he has recommended a policy of pursuing the gold route. His aim is that in ten years from now (2024), 100 percent of Dutch scientific publications will be open access, with 60 percent being open access in five years (2019).

Universities in the Netherlands have responded positively to the government's support.

# Springer and Dutch universities reach wide-ranging agreement on access

Innovative experimental approach includes subscription access and open access

Springer Science+Business Media and the Association of Dutch Universities (VSNU) have reached a landmark agreement which includes access to more than 2,000 of Springer's subscription journals as well as a commitment to rapidly moving toward open access publishing for all publicly financed research results from the Netherlands.

Although negotiations between VSNU and a number of STM publishers have been ongoing, the agreement with Springer is the first to be signed. Springer is no newcomer to open access, having introduced a hybrid open access model in 2004, and having acquired leading open access publisher BioMed Central in 2008. The agreement also follows the objective of Sander Dekker, State Secretary in the Ministry for Education, Culture and Science of the Netherlands, to have 60 percent of Dutch scientific output published using open access by 2019 with this percentage rising to 100% in 2025.

# Negotiations 2015-2016

Publisher	Status (April 10, 2015)
Elsevier	Negotiations have stalled because parties are still too far apart. Existing contract has been extended for 1 year, but is cancelled by December 31, 2015.
Springer	An agreement has been reached: from January 1, 2015 onwards NL researchers can publish open access in around 1500 Springer journals.
Wiley	An agreement has been reached for the big-deal 2015. From September 1, 2015 open access publishing is possible for all Dutch researchers with no extra costs. They will pay APC's in 2015 but the amount paid on APC's in 2015 will be 100% discounted in 2016.
Sage	A proposal was submitted, further negotiations.
Oxford University Press	Existing contract with OUP has been extended for 1 year to discuss Open Access further.
Other	Currently negotiations will start with a few other publishers; teams are made up now.
